to understand and use colloquial and common expressions about yourself, those around you and your environment.



to understand familiar names, statements and very simple phrases you may find in advertisements, posters or catalogs.



to write short, simple sentences, give details about yourself (name, nationality, address).



to communicate simply, provided the speaker speaks slowly, clearly and rephrases sentences if necessary.



using simple words to describe different situations, such as where you live and who you know.

to understand vocabulary and expressions used very frequently in relation to yourself (e.g. about yourself, your family, shopping, work) and to grasp the gist of simple, clear information.



short, simple texts. Reading will enable you to find specific information in different types of such as small advertisements, leaflets, timetables, etc., and help you understand short, simple personal letters.



short, simple notes and messages, as well as personal letters.



to communicate simple, routine tasks requiring a straightforward exchange of information on familiar topics and activities. You'll be able to have very brief exchanges, although you won't have enough vocabulary to carry on a conversation.



to use a series of sentences or expressions to describe your family, people, living conditions family, people, living conditions, your professional professional activity.

to understand the fundamental points when the speech is clear and standard on topics work, school and hobbies. When the language is relatively slow and distinct, then you'll be able to understand the gist of many radio or TV programs on current affairs or your areas of interest.



to understand texts written in everyday language related to your field of work. Reading will enable you to understand texts that describe events, recount experiences or express feelings and wishes.



simple, coherent texts on subjects that interest you personally. You'll be able to write personal letters describing experiences and impressions.



to cope with most situations you may encounter on a trip to a region where French is spoken. You'll be able to take part without preparation in conversations on topics you are familiar with, part of your daily life or of interest to you.



to pronounce expressions in a simple way, with the aim of recounting phrases and events, describe your dreams and hopes.

To briefly announce the reasons and explanations for your opinion or project.

And to tell a story or the plot of a book or film and express your reaction.

to communicate with a degree of spontaneity and ease that would make normal conversation with a native speaker, and to defend your opinions.



to express yourself clearly and in detail on a wide range of subjects related to your areas of interest. You'll learn to develop your point of view on a topical issue and explain the advantages and disadvantages of different options.



clear, detailed texts on your areas of interest. You can write essays or reports that convey information or explain the pros and cons of a given opinion. And finally, you'll be able to write letters that highlight the meaning you attribute to events and experiences.

You'll be able to write essays or reports that convey information or explain the pros and cons of a given opinion. And last but not least, you'll be able to write letters that emphasize the meaning you attribute to events and experiences.



to understand long, complex factual or literary texts, grasping differences in style.



by expressing yourself effectively and simply in your personal and professional life. You'll learn to take an active part in conversation in familiar situations, and to present or defend your points of view.



to communicate in a clear, well-structured way on most subjects of interest to you. You'll be able to develop your point of view on a topical issue, explaining the positive and negative points in different ways.
