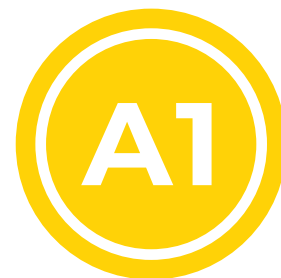


Discovering French?



With this general French course, you will :

(Semi-intensive in person program, 36 hours over 4 weeks)



LISTEN

to understand and use colloquial and common expressions about yourself, those around you and your environment.



READ

to understand familiar names, statements and very simple phrases you may find in advertisements, posters or catalogs.



WRITE

to write short, simple sentences, give details about yourself (name, nationality, address).



TAKE PART IN A CONVERSATION

to communicate simply, provided the speaker speaks slowly, clearly and rephrases sentences if necessary.



EXPRESS YOURSELF ORALLY

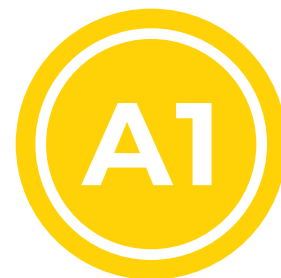
using simple words to describe different situations, such as where you live and who you know.

Objectives for level A1.1

- Greet, say goodbye, thank, apologize.
- Introduce yourself, ask about someone else's identity, introduce someone.
- Ask for/give personal information, talk about hobbies and interests.
- Make simple purchases, ask for/give prices, express definite and indefinite quantities and measures, indeterminate quantities and measurements.
- Order in a restaurant.
- Ask about places, describe/characterize places.
- Ask for/give instructions, directions.

Objectives for level A1.2

- Describe/characterize things, ask about things.
- Talk about your plans.
- Tell about your day.
- Ask for/give information about daily routines, a timetable.
- Make an appointment, ask for/give the time or times, give a date, suggest/accept/refuse an outing.
- Describe/characterize people.
- Describe a physical condition.

With this general French course, you will :

(Semi-intensive in person program, 36 hours over 4 weeks)



LISTEN

to understand vocabulary and expressions used very frequently in relation to yourself (e.g. about yourself, your family, shopping, work) and to grasp the gist of simple, clear information.



READ

short, simple texts. Reading will enable you to find specific information in different types of such as small advertisements, leaflets, timetables, etc., and help you understand short, simple personal letters.



WRITE

short, simple notes and messages, as well as personal letters.



TAKE PART IN A CONVERSATION

to communicate simple, routine tasks requiring a straightforward exchange of information on familiar topics and activities. You'll be able to have very brief exchanges, although you won't have enough vocabulary to carry on a conversation.



EXPRESS YOURSELF ORALLY

to use a series of sentences or expressions to describe your family, people, living conditions family, people, living conditions, your professional professional activity.

B1

With this general French course, you will :

(Semi-intensive in person program, 36 hours over 4 weeks)



LISTEN

to understand the fundamental points when the speech is clear and standard on topics work, school and hobbies. When the language is relatively slow and distinct, then you'll be able to understand the gist of many radio or TV programs on current affairs or your areas of interest.



READ

to understand texts written in everyday language related to your field of work. Reading will enable you to understand texts that describe events, recount experiences or express feelings and wishes.



WRITE

simple, coherent texts on subjects that interest you personally. You'll be able to write personal letters describing experiences and impressions.



TAKE PART IN A CONVERSATION

to cope with most situations you may encounter on a trip to a region where French is spoken. You'll be able to take part without preparation in conversations on topics you are familiar with, part of your daily life or of interest to you.



EXPRESS YOURSELF ORALLY

to pronounce expressions in a simple way, with the aim of recounting phrases and events, describe your dreams and hopes. To briefly announce the reasons and explanations for your opinion or project. And to tell a story or the plot of a book or film and express your reaction.

B2

With this general French course, you will :

(Semi-intensive in person program, 36 hours over 4 weeks)



LISTEN

to understand long lectures and speeches, and to follow complex arguments if the subject is relatively familiar to you. You'll be able to understand most current affairs TV programs and films in standard language.



READ

articles dealing with contemporary issues in which authors adopt a particular attitude or point of view. You'll also be able to understand a contemporary literary prose text.



TAKE PART IN A CONVERSATION

to communicate with a degree of spontaneity and ease that would make normal conversation with a native speaker, and to defend your opinions.



EXPRESS YOURSELF ORALLY

to express yourself clearly and in detail on a wide range of subjects related to your areas of interest. You'll learn to develop your point of view on a topical issue and explain the advantages and disadvantages of different options.



WRITE

clear, detailed texts on your areas of interest. You can write essays or reports that convey information or explain the pros and cons of a given opinion. And finally, you'll be able to write letters that highlight the meaning you attribute to events and experiences.
